## READINGS

### First Reading 2 Corinthians.4. 5-12

For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you For we do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for.

### Gospel Reading - Mark 2. 23-3.6

**Pronouncement about the Sabbath** One sabbath he was going through the cornfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, 'Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?' And he said to them, 'Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions.' Then he said to them, 'The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath.'

The Man with a Withered Hand Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, 'Come forward.' Then he said to them, 'Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?' But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, 'Stretch out your hand.' He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him

### KCB Summer School - Reading the Bible

The Bible is a central resource for our faith as Christians. But reading the Bible isn't always easy, for all sorts of reasons. For one thing, we generally regard it as one book, but in fact it's made up of a whole host of individual books. For another, it's very old - written across the best part of a thousand years, with the most recent parts of it themselves written some two thousand years ago. Most of us don't regularly read ancient texts; when we do, we recognize that we might find it difficult to enter the world within which they were written. Yet another factor is that it was written in a variety of languages, so most readers today come to it in translation, which brings its own challenges.

The aim of this Summer School is to give an overview of the Bible as a text - the kinds of writings it contains and the contexts in which they were written. We can become more informed readers, understanding more about the literary style and nature of Biblical writings, looking afresh at what it says and how it says it, so that we can listen more attentively to what God is saying through it to us today.

The Summer School will take place in Kildwick Parish Rooms on the following dates, between 7.30pm and 9pm:

Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> June, 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> July. Please bring a Bible along with you!

It would be helpful to have an idea of numbers, so if you would like to come, can you please let me know (phone and e-mail contacts are in the magazine). There will also be sign-up sheets in church. I hope that you will find the sessions interesting and informative, and that perhaps you will find yourself looking at this familiar, much-loved (but not always easy to understand) book with new eyes.
