Recycling for Good Causes - Can I remind you that at the back of church, you'll find a sack into which you can deposit all manner of items which can be recycled? Recycling is important as we all know: it's one way which we can lessen our use of resources and help to protect the environment – and we are paid for it! Ok, it's not a huge amount of money, but small amounts help! So what can we put in? Any unwanted jewellery: gold, silver or costume jewellery and damaged items are fine. (For example, I have a box of single earrings which I will now get rid of! The charity will also take any currency (notes or coins) which you have lurking in a drawer. Stamps are welcome, as are albums, First Day covers and presentation packs and postcards. Perhaps the most useful category is mobile phones, cameras and gadgets (including damaged or broken goods!) Video cameras, old film cameras, SLRs and lenses, sat navs, game consoles,

games and other accessories, Ipods, MP3 players, laptops and tablet computers. Please though: NO ink or toner cartridges.

Readings - Ephesians 6.10-20

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints. Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it boldly, as I must speak.

GOSPEL READING -John 6. 59-69

He said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum. When many of his disciples heard it, they said, 'This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?' But Jesus, being aware that his disciples were complaining about it, said to them, 'Does this offend you? Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the first who were the ones that did not believe, and who was the one that would betray him. And he said, 'For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father.'

Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So Jesus asked the twelve, 'Do you also wish to go away?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come tbelieve and know that you are the Holy One of God.'
