At Messy Church There will be lots of fun activities for parents and children to do together. Then there will time to worship God before everybody shares food. Offers of help most welcome.

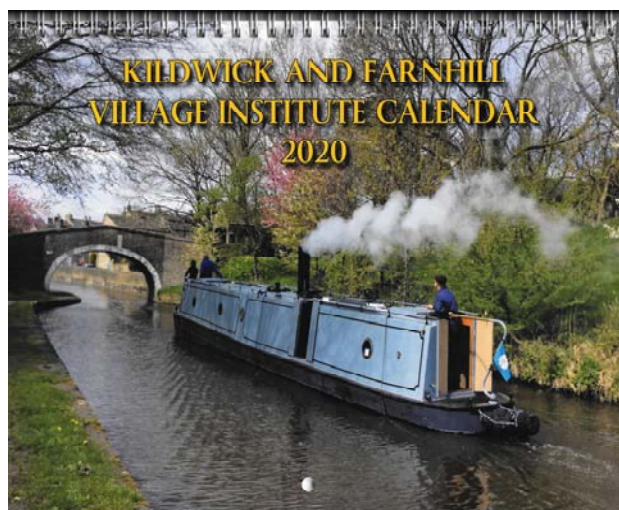
Choir Practice - has been cancelled and will resume on Tuesday November 12th.

Jesus Calls Levi
