I tell you of them.

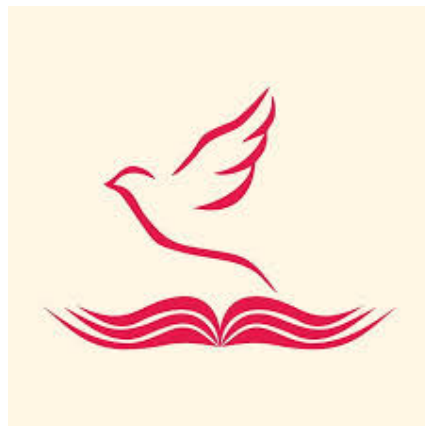
Gospel Reading – Matthew 3. 13-17
